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## The Minor Prophets: Joel

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During 2025, we will be journeying together through the minor prophets. This month I invite you to read the book of Joel. We normally hear from the prophet Joel at two times during the church year:

- On Ash Wednesday, a reading from Joel is the appointed Old Testament reading.
- On Pentecost, Peter quotes Joel in his sermon in Acts 2.

Joel is a unique book. The author was clearly immersed in other biblical writings.

- Take away: It's important to understand the broad sweep of Scripture. It's why we regularly read the whole Bible.

Joel invites us to repentance. We tend to link repentance to Lent (in the church year) or the confession (in worship). But Martin Luther says that the entire life of believers is to be one of repentance (see the first of the 95 Theses).

- Take away: How is God calling you from your sin and toward him?

Joel tells us God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love. This is not the only book of the Bible that describes this character trait of God. Joel is also a book of restoration and hope, for the day when God will fully and finally deal with evil.

- Take away: How are you being invited to trust and rest in God?

### Love Everyone

*I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you.*

**John 13:15**

I can vividly imagine the foot-washing scene in the Gospel of John: Jesus taking off his outer garment, wrapping a towel around his waist, kneeling to remove the disciples' sandals, and then washing and drying one dusty foot after another. My eyes well up at the image. If the Savior of the world was willing to take on such a humble task, we should all be willing to serve others too, regardless of who we are and who they are. Following Jesus' example of servant leadership means being willing to engage with those around us no matter their background. Because of Jesus' love for us, we can show love to everyone, no matter our similarities or differences. So let us strive to show others a love that respects everyone's right to have differing opinions. A love that asks, "How can I help you?" A love that acknowledges our own weaknesses and short comings - a love that focuses on Jesus.

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### **Isaiah 117 House Update**

As of now, we are actively working on finalizing all the necessary steps before we can break ground. We've been working through the process of surveying the land and securing its release from a larger parcel. We are nearly finished with this step and are very close to having the land officially transferred into our name. Our next step will be to submit architectural plans to the City of Oregon in order to apply for building permits. After receiving approval, we'll be ready for our groundbreaking, which we hope to hold in the early part of 2025.

To date, we have raised over \$200,000 in monetary donations, in addition to the land donation, and countless local individuals, organizations and businesses have stepped up to organize their own donation drives and fundraisers. These efforts have been pivotal in helping us get closer to our goal.

There is still much work to be done. In order to open our doors the home must be fully debt-free, plus, we need to have the first year's operating budget of \$175,000 in the bank. We are committed to ensuring that once the house is built, it will be fully equipped and ready to serve without the burden of debt.


