The Minor Prophets: Jonah

Dear Brothers and sisters in Christ,

During 2025, we will be journeying together through the minor prophets. /This month I invite you to read the book of Jonah.

Jonah is probably the most well-known of all the minor prophets, but perhaps for all the wrong reasons. We remember the large fish that made an underwater tomb (Or is it a womb?) for Jonah and then vomits him back up. But we might miss the point of the book: God's love for our enemies... and our frustration with that kind of forgiving love.

Jonah is a reluctant prophet, He is so reluctant that his first response to God's call to go to Nineveh is to run (sail) the complete opposite direction. When he finally does go to Nineveh he preaches a very short sermon and then gets out of Dodge to see if God will fry the evil Ninevites. In a surprising turn of events, however, the Ninevites repent and turn to God. But Jonah is not happy about it. The book ends with Jonah's frustration about God's mercy.

A Lesson In Serving

“Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me.” Matthew 25:40

After a rough day at work, I stopped at the store, I got what I needed and chose the shortest check-out line, The man in front of me had a basket of groceries, I knew that he must have used food stamps to cover part of the cost because he told the cashier he should only have to pay for his can of soda. The cashier scrolled through the list, taking what seemed like forever. I just wanted to check out and go home. Finally the cashier found that his food stamps could not be used to pay for his strawberries. The man asked her to check again. At this point, I thought, How much longer will this take? Then the man behind me said, “Give him his strawberries, I’ll cover it all.” The man with the food stamps told him, “Thank you. I just became homeless last night.”

I was ashamed of myself for my selfish thoughts and lack of action. Why had I not been like the man behind me and offered to cover this man’s purchase? This experience reminded me that we are to have compassion and humility, always moving to serve others as Christ commands. God will always provide up opportunities to serve. We need only to turn our thoughts from ourselves to the person in front of us.

Opportunities to love God are right in front of me.

MARCH 2025 CHURCH FINANCES

For March 2025, we had a beginning balance of \$103.26, receipts of \$31,715.08, expenses of \$27,840.15 and an ending balance of \$3,978.19. We benefitted from having 5 Sundays in the month of March.

During our Spring maintenance inspection, our Wadsworth tech found the compressor on the 10-Ton condenser A/C unit was fried. This unit supplies air conditioning to our church sanctuary. It is thought that a lightning strike knocked out the compressor. The quote to repair is \$12,995.

On April 11, the Sunday School wing lost heat. A bad relay and deteriorated wiring was discovered. Repairs will be provided by an electrician.

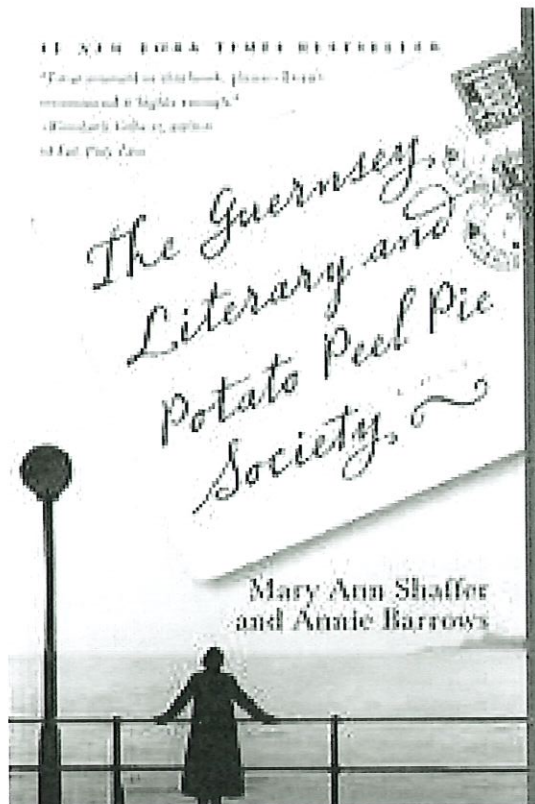

The meeting opened with devotion from the Small Catechism & Prayer by Pastor Matt.

Cindy made a motion seconded by Jon to approve minutes from the March 10 council meeting. MC.

Mark made a motion seconded by Cindy to approve March 2025 Treasurer's Report. MC.

Pastor's Report: Easter April 20; **Confirmation:** TBD; **Rogation Days:** May 27-28; **Ascension Day** (worship at Solomon Woodville): May 29; **Pentecost:** June 8, **Ryder Nino** Baptism: March 23. March Pastoral Care & Visits total was 19; Confirmation Retreat March 21-22 at Lutheran Memorial Camp / HopeWood Pines.
