The Minor Prophets: Haggai

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During 2025, we will be journeying together through the minor prophets. This month I invite you to read the book of Haggai.

The book of the prophet Haggai is set years after the exile to Babylon. Persia is the new empire and has allowed the exiled Israelites to return to Jerusalem. Haggai has four things to say:

- He critiques those returning for building their own houses first while God's temple still lies in ruins. They heed his call and get to work on the temple.
- But then they are disappointed, because the new temple is nowhere near as glorious as the former temple. So Haggai reminds the people of God's promises and gives them hope.
- Haggai then uses an example from Leviticus to share how their apathy and injustice will be transmitted to their work rebuilding the temple, and calls them to renewed faithfulness.
- And he finally ends on a future note of hope... that God will renew the world from his "home base" of Jerusalem. When will this happen? We will have to read the last two minor prophets, Zechariah and Malachi, to find out.

Prayer: Dear heavenly Father, thanks you for calling us to be your servants in the world. Help us to live according to Christ's teachings. Amen.





ST. PETER LUTHERAN COUNCIL MEETING
Monday, August 11, 2025 at Church

Attendance: Gary Diefenthaler, Judy Gahler, Wes Gahler, Jody Kapp, Jon Overmyer, Kim Reif and Pastor Matt Musteric Guest – LeAnne Butzin

The meeting was opened by Pastor Matt with a devotion based on the Small Catechism: The Lord's Prayer : Salutation and prayer.

Jon made a motion seconded by Judy to approve the minutes from the July 7, 2025 council meeting. MC Judy made a motion seconded by Jon to approve the July 2025 Treasurer's Report. MC. The July beginning balance shows as \$12,619.89 and an ending balance of \$6,568.07. It was discussed that there was some issues with Portico in June and the June Treasurer's report should be corrected

Pastor's Report: Worship: Blessing of the Backpacks Aug. 24, Wedding: Wolf and Cutlip Aug. 30, Sept. 7 God's Work Our Hands. Pastoral Acts: Helen Amonette: July 9 (hospice chaplain presiding). Pastoral Care and Visits for June and July totaled 26. Teaching: Catechism classes will start in September, with a parent meeting in August or early September. Bible study will resume in September and run through March, considering a series on the prophets. Other: Dedication of the Isaiah 117 House was on July 16. Led a workshop on spiritual practices for Community of Christ Lutheran, Whitehouse, on July 17. Continuing Education: Reframing Compassion Workshops in Toledo on June 30, July 14 and Aug. 11. Giving USA Briefing (trends in charitable giving) July 17. Kate Bowler at Lakeside July 24. Sabbatical: Grant application decision will be announced by Aug. 31, 2025.

President Report: We continue to be in need of a Church Council Recording Secretary and an additional person and chairman for the Finance Ministry.

Vice-President Report: Has been in contact with Ameriprise to see what is needed to get authorized accesses updated. Still waiting to hear back from them.

Executive Committee: No report

Congregational Life: BBQ update: Mt. Carmel and the fire department will not loan out their racks. Don Lajti's racks will not handle chickens. Hoping we can do a Pork Chop BBQ on Nov. 2. Still working on setting a date to attend a Mud Hens baseball game.

Education: Finalized Vacation Bible School plans. Working on Sunday School roster. Continued to discuss Sunday School material. Holding a Sunday School teacher meeting on Aug 10. Rally Day activities will begin at 10:15am on Sept. 14 in the fellowship hall. Asked council if we wanted to see if St. Luke's would want to join in on Rally Day and have a combined service. Next meeting is August 12 at 7pm,

Finance: No report. Still in need of a Finance chairperson.

Property: Tom Ottney did water testing and filed the report. Randy Reif had Northwood Door repair pivots on the East doors.

Outreach: Grace Alone – Furniture Ministry is collecting bedding during the month of August. Estate Planning Essentials Seminar will be September 21 at 11:45am with a free meal provided. We are asking all of our church members to submit their family photos for our Instant Church Directory. Names of the members, having submitted photos by Sept. 1, will be placed in a drawing for one bushel of Big Dave's sweet corn. God's Work Our Hands is September 7.

Worship: No report.

Women of the Church: No report..

Old Business: Various council members met with our Mennonite Mutual insurance company agent. Discussion was held about premiums and claim submissions. We have had 3 claims in the last 5 years, which impacts our premiums. There are very few companies that insure churches. We could put in a claim but we would take a chance on not being able to renew our policy next year. It was decided not to proceed with any insurance claims at this time.

Gary made a motion seconded by Jody to discuss HVAC repairs and cost estimates as part of the upcoming annual meeting in November 2025. MC

Office copier lease is due to renew in February 2026. Our current lease has a monthly base of \$207, usually about \$40 more for excess B&W copies and \$65 for color copies. Generally, monthly copier expense is around \$306. We have a new 5 year lease quote for a RICOH copier that is structured at a base of \$284 (includes 5000 B&W copies and 500 Color copies), estimated B&W overage of \$7 and estimated color overage of \$10 for an estimated monthly expense of \$306.

Judy made a motion seconded by Gary to enter into a new 5 year copier lease. MC

New Business: Judy made a motion seconded by Jody to invite St. Luke's to have a combined service at St. Peter on September 14 and join in our Rally Day activities. MC

Jon made a motion seconded by Judy to adjourn the meeting. MC. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
