Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During 2025, we will be journeying together through the minor prophets. This month I invite you to read the book of Zechariah.

The book of the prophet Zechariah is set toward the end of the exile to Babylon. God communicates to the prophet Zechariah through strange dreams and visions (chapters 1-8). You can listen to all the details on the Bible Project website (<https://bibleproject.com/videos/zechariah/>).

The people ask if God's kingdom is coming soon. When will it be? The prophet flips the question and asks the people if they are ready to be the kind of people who are ready to receive the kingdom. Zechariah also speaks of the coming kingdom of the Messiah, showing us what it will be like (chapters 9-14).

While the book of the prophet Zechariah is a wild ride with lots of imagery, it is also a book of hope.

An Abundant Catch

Read Matthew 4:18-22

*I was hungry and you gave me food to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me a drink.
I was a stranger and you welcomed me...Matthew 25:35 (CEB)*

Years ago I lived in Key West, Florida. One morning we were catching mahi-mahi almost as fast as we could bait the hooks. We realized we had more fish than we could eat, so we headed back to shore. The skipper gave us an address where we could take the extra fish.

Six nights a week, the Catholic Sisters served supper to people living in poverty. We gave them our fish and were invited back for dinner. As the Mother superior blessed the meal, she said, "A Catholic, a Protestant, and a Jew provided our meal tonight. Regardless of your heritage, all are welcome to eat at God's table."

Gift was simple – indeed the fish would have spoiled if we hadn't given them away. However, it transformed the rest of my time in Key West. Hardly a week went by when someone didn't stop me on the street and ask, "Aren't you the guy who brought us the fish? God bless you."

Until then I had never seen those people who were struggling. People are still struggling. Look around at those who are cold, lonely, and hungry. There are countless ways to support them. The rewards of giving far exceed the value of the gift.

Prayer: Dear God, thank you for opportunities to share what we have. Open our eyes to the people in need around us, and guide us to support them. Amen.

Thought for the day: God can do great things with simple gifts.

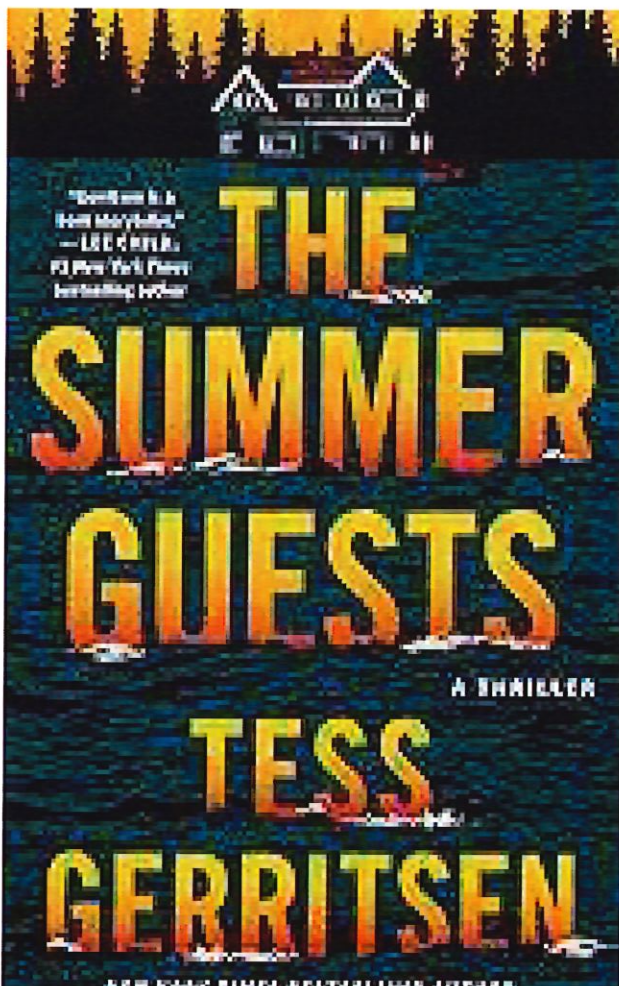

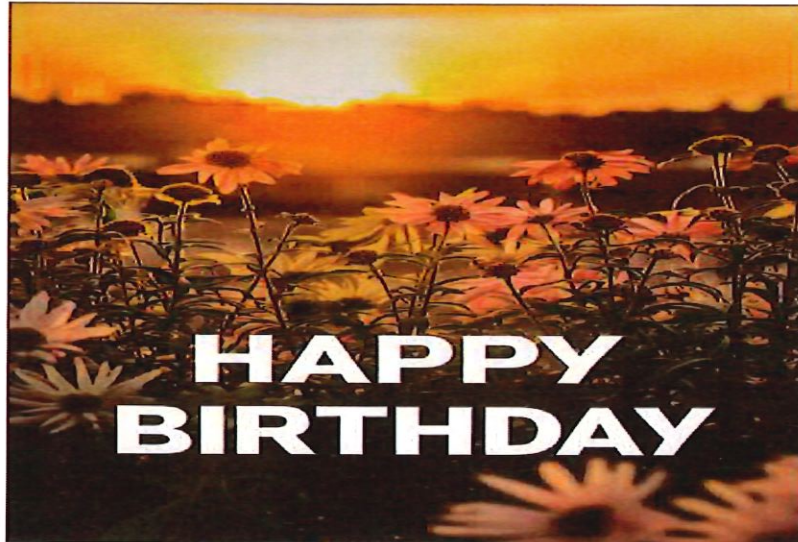

Monday, September 15, 2025 at Church

Attendance: Cindy Bench, Gary Diefenthaler, Al Gahler, Judy Gahler, Wes Gahler, Jody Kapp, Jon Overmyer, and Pastor Matt Musteric

The meeting was opened by Pastor Matt with a devotion based on the Small Catechism: The Lord's Prayer: The First Petition and prayer.

Jody made a motion seconded by Judy to approve the minutes from the August 11, 2025 council meeting. MC Jody made a motion seconded by Judy to file the August 2025 Treasurer's Report for audit. MC. The July ending balance showed as \$6,568.07 and the August beginning balance showed as \$3,592.79.

Pastor's Report: Worship: Joint service at St. Peter's Sept, 14, Women's Thankoffering Oct. 5, Guest Pastor, Greg Olsen Oct.26. Pastoral Acts: Wedding: Jennifer Wolf and Brian Cutlip Aug. 30. Pastoral Care and Visits for August totaled 16. Teaching: Catechism will focus on the Small Catechism, Bible Study will be on the book of Leviticus. Continuing Education: Global Leadership Summit Aug. 7-8, Reframing Compassion Workshops at Cherry Street Mission on Aug. 11, Association of Fundraising Professionals, NW Ohio "Putting Donors First" Aug 27. Sabbatical: Grant application was not awarded.

President Report: Due to a computer error on the supplier's end, we owe \$5,400 in propane costs for the 2024-2025 season. This will increase our propane budget to around \$1,600 a month for the 2025-2026 season. No penalties are being applied. The propane rate will be locked in at \$1.38 per gallon.

Vice-President Report: By Sept. 24, the church office will have access to a credit card.

Executive Committee: No report

Congregational Life: Plans are underway for a Pork Chop BBQ on Nov. 2.

Education: Using a new Whirl lectionary program for Preschool and Kindergarten class. Planning for Rally Day on Sept. 14. Holding Sunday School Teacher meeting on Sept. 28. Dawn Bolen has joined the Ministry. Next meeting is to be determined.

Finance: Cindy made a motion seconded by Jody to have Gail Overmyer and Jon Overmyer be placed on the church's Ameriprise accounts as authorized contact persons. MC. Ministries were reminded to have their budget requests prepared by the October council meeting.

Property: Electrician will work us into the schedule for our needed kitchen repairs. Annual contract for HVAC maintenance is up for renewal with Wadsworth. No other quotes were received from any other companies. New contract is for \$5,398.00 for Aug. 1 – July 31 and includes the same services as prior year. Price increase is \$208 from prior year. Jon made a motion seconded by Cindy to renew the annual HVAC maintenance contract with Wadsworth. MC. Next meeting is Oct. 12 at 10am.

Outreach: Blue Barrel August donations were peanut butter and jelly to St. Paul, September will be cereal to Elliston. Pam Frayer is organizing the Caring Shepherds. Seminar Sept. 21 at 11:45am will be Legal Issues discussion. Instant church directory still needs some member pictures. Jean Witt has been the driving force in this effort. God's Work Our Hands was at Luther Home of Mercy helping residents enjoy fishing, at Salem planting trees and at St. Luke's baking cookies and writing notes. Jim Vermilyea was collecting bedding in August. Next meeting is September 21 at 1:30pm.

Worship: Will be trying a couple new settings. 1st Sunday – children's sermon Pastor, 2nd Sunday - children's bells, 3rd Sunday – children's sermon. Sanctuary piano has been tuned. Will have fellowship hall and chapel pianos tuned. Next meeting Nov. 12 at 4pm.

Gary made a motion seconded by Cindy to adjourn the meeting. MC. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

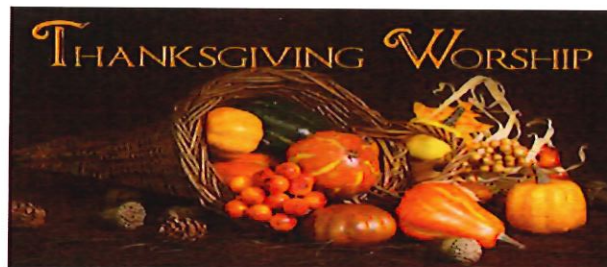
